Behavioral Health Division Director’s Report Budget Update	<p>Rosie Anderson-Harper</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NASAD-Increasing medication assisted treatment. Missouri is a leader in this process. SAMHSA is also pushing medication assisted treatment. • There will be a huge recovery march in Washington D.C. • Excellence in Mental Health Act-rumors-DD funding will not go through this. • Mark Stringer testified on the Opioid problem. The link will be sent to the council members. • Starting Plan for 2016 budget. SB509 may affect the budget. • Grant monies-prevention and treatment grants have been applied for by DBH. • Fulton State Hospital ground breaking-Wednesday May 27th. Excellence in Mental Health Initiative Update	<p>Dorn Schuffman, Coordinator of Excellence in MH Initiative</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Updated the council on the new guidelines and requirements to participate in the planning grant. • There is \$25 million available. Each state applying is to submit a funding proposal up to \$2 million. If 25 states do not apply for the planning grant other states could receive more money. • The planning grant application is due August. 5th. Grant will be awarded October1. Notification must be given to consumers, family members, providers, etc. about the plan. Providers will have to be certified. Prospective payment option will have to be established. Provide all the services are required. • The grant would cover the whole state and not just the metropolitan areas. 	
Recovery Home Zoning Ordinances	<p>Joe Hahne, Chairman</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The City of Springfield is holding a public hearing to talk about the zoning for what will be allowed for community/group/recovery homes. They are purposing that they will not be allowed in certain areas and moved into an industrial area. • Several individuals went to a council meeting and spoke and asked why wouldn't you want to live next to me? They told their recovery stories to enlighten the council members about who they are and about their recovery.

Committee Workgroup Reports	<p>ACT MO</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prescription drug disposal bags are being sent to regional support centers. The pills are environmentally safe-place the unused medications in bag and fill with water. • Individuals are able to buy these bags also. More information is available on the ACT MO website. • Several agencies are working on long term solutions for the disposal of unused prescriptions. • The Mayor of Jefferson City signed a proclamation stating that marijuana use is bad for children. <p>Missouri Credentialing Board</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Changes-compulsive gambling credential name is changing and new certificates are being mailed. • Renewal season is coming to a close. • MRSS/P-changes begin July 1. Training increases from 42 hours to 46 hours. • There are currently at least 100 people signed up for the next training. • Part time staff will be hired.

They are working on a scope and job description of a peer.
