1. Under this parallel system, the Chair and the Chair-elect terms would run for a period of two years, in which the Chair-elect would serve as the assistant to the Chair and temporarily serve as Chair in his/her absence. At the end of this two-year period the Chair-elect would become ADA/SAC Chair with a consensus vote by the ADA/SAC Advisory Committee and a new Chair-elect would be selected by nomination and majority consensus vote.

2. In the event the Chair does not complete his/her term; the Chair-elect would succeed with a majority consensus vote by the ADA/SAC Committee and a new Chair-elect would be nominated and selected by majority vote. If at the time of succession the Chair-elect does not receive a majority consensus vote; then elections will be held and a new Chair and Chair-elect will be nominated and selected. For the period time that could exist for the new Chair and Chair-elect to be nominated and selected, an Interim Chair will be appointed by the Division Director.

3. Under this proposed system of parallel succession; the Chair-elect would serve two years as Assistant to the Committee Chair, with the possibility of replacing the Chair in his/her absence. At the end of the Chair's two year term, the Chair-elect with the consensus vote of the ADA/SAC Advisory Committee would become Chair. Ensuring that whomever is sitting in the Chair position has the experience, knowledge, and background to provide outstanding leadership for the ADA/SAC Advisory Committee.
