Prevention Update-Angela Stuckenschneider, Director of Prevention

- ACT Missouri will host the 2012 Prevention Conference, *Missouri Champions of Prevention*, on December 4-5, 2012. The Conference will be held at the Lodge of Four Seasons in Lake Ozark. - The Seventh Annual *Show Me You Care about Suicide Prevention* Conference will be held September 13-14, 2012, at the Capitol Plaza Hotel, in Jefferson City. John Draper, Ph.D., Project Director of the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline will deliver the opening keynote. A three-hour workshop will be conducted on Friday by Dr. Heidi Horsley, an internationally known expert on grief. - The Behavioral Health Epidemiology Workgroup (BHEW) data querying website is now live! This website can be used to obtain a variety of behavioral health data in a format that can easily be copy and pasted into your own work. This information is primarily at the state level with some sources allowing you to narrow down to the county level. Data sources include:
 - The Missouri Student Survey
 - The National Survey of Drug Use and Health
 - Treatment Data from both the Divisions of Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Comprehensive Psychiatric Services.
 - State agency data previously found on the Status Report
 - Census Data

- The Division recently applied for the SAMHSA Partnerships for Success grant. Missouri will use data-informed decision-making to target underage drinking in high-need communities and prescription drug misuse among college students. Using currently available data, three communities have been identified with elevated prevalence of underage drinking: Butler, Jefferson, and Boone counties. Missouri's initiative seeks to lower alcohol use among students age 12 to 18 from current rates in Butler (21%), Jefferson (25%), and Boone (21%) counties to less than the current state average (19%). The statewide coalition consisting of 21 colleges and universities (14 public and 7 private) – with a combined student population of about 161,000 – will target prescription drug misuse among Missouri college students.

SATOP Update-Steve Deets, SATOP Director

- The SATOP Serious and Repeat Offender Program (SROP) expansion continued with the issue of contract amendments that became effective 2/28/2012, 4/1/2012, and 6/1/2012, adding three new SROP service providers and 10 sites. Total numbers regarding SROP services are as follows:
 - 20 SROP services providers.
 - 76 SROP services locations.
 - 34 of 41 DWI Courts approved by the Drug Court Coordinating Commission (DCCC) are utilizing the SROP.
- SATOP continues to assist providers in getting services up and going at the new locations. Also, efforts are devoted to making the SROP services available to existing DCCC approved DWI Courts that lack those services and for DWI Courts with DCCC approval pending or planned.
