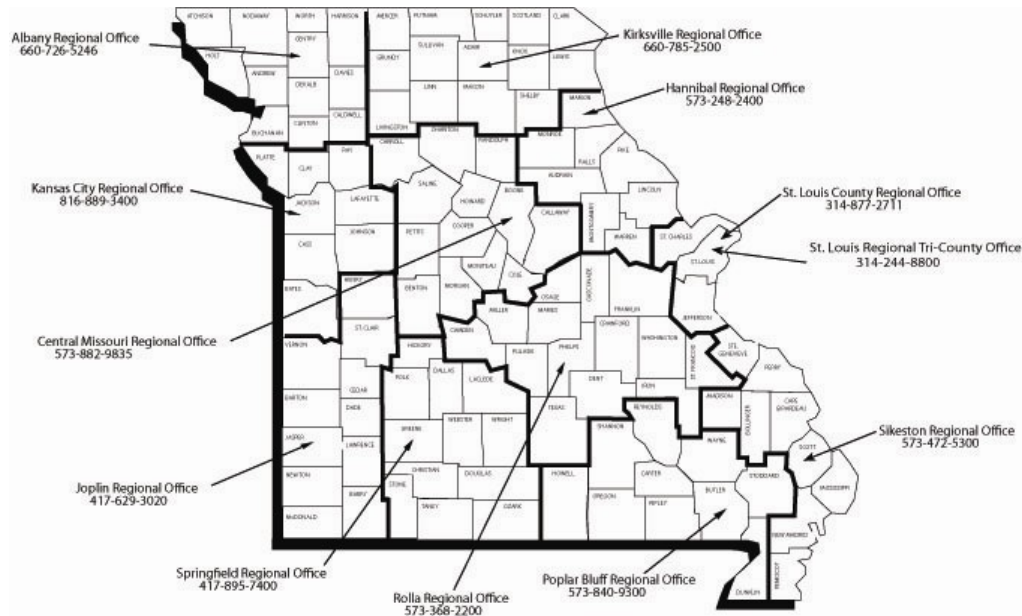


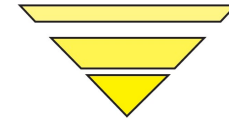

Career Planning and Development

Ways to Assist Youth & Adults in Securing Employment

- Planning beginning at an early age creates an expectation of work/career
- Career exploration and work experience in high school contributes significantly to post-school employment, higher wages, and more continuous employment
- Participation in work-study, high school vocational education, and course work that integrates occupational and academic skills
- Positive family involvement, which leads to better academic outcomes and fewer high-risk behaviors, and a greater likelihood of success after high school.

Two Key Components for Employment and a Fulfilling Life

- Self-Determination
- Career Planning & Development

It's Hard to Plan If You Don't Know What You Want

Where are you on your career development path?

- Have limited or no ideas about what you are interested in pursuing for employment
- Have an idea about what you want to do, but no formal plan guiding the way to employment
- Have clearly defined employment goals and a formal plan in the IEP or Individualized Plan for Employment that is being implemented to guide you

How to get started?

- Express your interest/desire to work (telling someone you want to begin exploring career options)
- Get involved in career planning & career exploration
- Get connected to community resources such as the career centers, regional office, vocational rehabilitation, local SB40 Board.
