



Missouri Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse National Guard Initiative

The Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse is collaborating with the Missouri National Guard to offer substance abuse consultation and evaluations, assessments, and treatment services at no cost to Missouri National Guard Soldiers.

Protocol for accessing services:

- National Guard soldiers with substance abuse problems may make direct contact with any substance abuse treatment provider on the **National Guard Substance Abuse Assessment/Evaluation Contact List**.
- Identify yourself as a National Guard soldier and present your military identification card to receive services at no cost. Consultations with National Guard soldiers should occur within two weeks of your initial contact with the treatment provider.
- If you are being referred for the evaluation by the National Guard, please present the Release of Information form from the National Guard and indicate you need a written evaluation.

The evaluation, consultation, and all subsequent services delivered are confidential; information about your participation will only be released to the National Guard if you sign a written release.

Services available:

- Behavioral Health Consultation with Report
- Individual Counseling
 - Individual Counseling –Motivational
 - Individual Counseling –Trauma
- Group Counseling
- Medication Assisted Treatment
- Residential or Outpatient services
- Recovery Support
