Call To Order	Chairman Ladell Flowers called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Introductions were made.

Behavioral Health Division Director’s Report	<p>Rosie Anderson-Harper, Director of Recovery Services, Division Director Report</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Disease Management-currently 18 providers participating with an enrollment of approximately 1,391. The individuals that are sought to participate are high-cost Medicaid eligible individuals with a diagnosed substance use disorder, current CSTAR qualifying Medicaid eligible, \$20,000 or greater in combined Medicaid pharmacy and medical costs, & no medical claims for hospice, dialysis, hemophilia, or ICFMR (skilled nursing facility). • A Wellness Coaching Train-the-Trainers is currently being conducted. An Outreach Toolkit is being provided. Allyson Ashley is also visiting each site. More information is available at:http://dmh.mo.gov/ada/provider/DiseaseManagement3700SubstanceUseDisorders.htm • Access to Recovery-the grant has been submitted to SAMHSA • Strengthening Mental Health-is going very well and have many success stories. • Mental Health First Aid Training-still taking place and going very well. • Medicaid Expansion- • Fulton State Hospital-Monies have been allocated and an architect has been selected. • 2014 Mental Health Champions’ Banquet-Will be held at the Capital Plaza Hotel in Jefferson City on Tuesday, June 3, 2014. • Housing-The Department Housing Unit has published a revised application for Shelter Plus Care and a new companion form and Participant HMIS information form. • Health Care Homes-Continues to have successful results. There is some conversations related to individuals with co-occurring psychiatric and substance use disorders. Are looking at the use of best practices and referrals to CSTARs if appropriate; educate the nursing staff on how to address substance use disorders, etc. • Health Care Home for children and youth-On April 21 an overview presentation will be done by Dr. Wilfley and Dr. Nichols.

	<p>2014.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New Decision Items–Increased Medication Costs. This includes an inflationary increase of 4.23% and funding for the increased MAT utilization by SA providers. • \$1,066,864–Provider Rate Increase Cost to Continue. • \$487,025–Additional federal authority to support SROP conversion to CSTAR beginning July 1, 2014. • \$600,000–Additional SATOP MHEF authority to cover projected expenditures. • 2% provider rate increase. • House recommends a 1% Cost of Living Adjustment for state employees effective January 1, 2015. • Core Adjustments–(\$1,000,000) GR–Core reduction of one time funding for the ADA Treatment Services for Offenders leaving prison to go to STL area NDI appropriated in FY 2014. • \$2,648,079 FED –Medicaid authority reallocated from ACP to ADA Treatment Services for ADA DM. • \$9,000 GR – Reallocation in Prevention to align the provider COLA appropriated in FY 2014. • \$685,409 GR – Reduction from ADA Treatment for FMAP adjustment. 	
SATOP	<p>Mark Rembecki, Director of SATOP</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are four levels for SATOP-Level 1-Offender Education Program-10 hours; Level 2-Weekend Intervention Program-20 hrs over a 48 hour weekend-typically takes place at a hotel. The first two levels are education only. Level 3-Clinical Intervention Program-50 hrs, 10 hrs individual counseling, 20 hrs group education, 20 hrs group counseling. Level 4-Serious and Repeat Offender Program-minimum of 90 days, 75 hrs minimum-based on clinical need for serious report offenders. There are now 95 sites for the level 4 treatment. There are different structures of fees. • All DWI courts have a SROP working with them. • Jon asked if there is any SATOP aftercare (repeat offenders especially). Mark replied that once an offender successfully completes SATOP, there isn't aftercare to keeping them engaged outside of possibly the courts. Depending on the judge, repeat offenders in conjunction with the DWI court may continue to be engaged in treatment until graduation. He agrees that there is a need for looking at ways to incorporate aftercare not necessarily through SATOP. • Diane asked if there is a way in SROP to bill after successful completion. Some individuals would like to continue treatment (group counseling), but can't afford to do it unless it can be billed. There is currently not an option nor a billing code for extended treatment. • Recently a workgroup was comprised to conduct a comprehensive analysis of SATOP and provide recommendations to the Division to improve the effectiveness of SATOP. The workgroup consisted of judges, a prosecuting attorney, SATOP Administrators, etc. which met over a 5 month period to provide recommendations to the Division on improving the effectiveness of SATOP. A report from that workgroup should be coming out in the near future. There were 11 recommendations that came were submitted for review by the Division. Mark will be providing two presentations at the upcoming judicial colleges with Judge Ohlms and Judge Williams to better educate attendees on the structure, goals, and outcomes of SATOP. 	
ACA Update	<p>Misty Snodgrass, Director of Public Policy MOCCMHC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A power point presentation was provided to the Committee. 	

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By-Laws Update & Staggered Elections	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Staggered Election document will be updated and submitted to the ADA SAC executive committee. The By-Laws do not have to be amended. Stephanie Washington will serve on the nominations committee. Jon was asked to step off the committee due to a conflict of interest because he was nominated for the Chair-Elect position. Gloria moved that the nominations be opened for the Chair-Elect position and Sandra seconded. Three individuals were nominated and accepted. Gloria nominated Sandra, and Sandra nominated Stephanie and Jon. Nominations will remain open until May 6, 2014. Committee Workgroup Reports	<p>Prevention Workgroup</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Susan Depue discussed the PSS partnership grant-They would like to change the student sample to go from random rather than convenient. In 2016 they will be doing the random sample which will be 60 students from 96 schools. They also talked about possibly adding in the information about the e-cigarette to the survey. There is a legislative bill for the e-cigarette to be sold only to individuals over 18. Currently there are no restrictions so children can purchase it in stores and on-line. There are a lot of municipalities who are rewording their language to include the e-cigarettes. Some private business' are banning them and are being challenged. Hookah-a battery powered device similar to e-cigarettes uses a liquid nicotine that you pour into the device. Research is coming out on them-1 teaspoon getting on a child can cause, vomiting, seizure & death, and 1 tablespoon on adults causing same thing. Animals are also getting ahold of these and dying. Mike suggested that someone come and speak to the ADA SAC about e-cigarettes. There is a medical marijuana bill in senate, a bill to legalize marijuana and synthetic marijuana, and there are 6 bills pending in the house. There is one bill to decriminalize marijuana. Colorado's is looking at data on automobile accidents related to marijuana. The Prevention Committee will start looking at the reports and bringing the information to the SAC committee. <p>Treatment Workgroup</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> MRSS-P-Credentialing-discussion on finding funding sources-small grants, potential fee for those who participate in training were some of the ideas. There was also discussion on providing training available for providers as well as for leadership. We get individuals trained and then what? A treatment committee workgroup has been formed. Members are Lisa Martin, Gloria Nepote, Joe Hahne, Ladell Flowers & Brenda Schell. Recovery Support Purposed Rules-in the process of standardizing them. Tara Crawford gave a report on the wellness coaching training. There are 8 dimensions of wellness-emotional, financial, social, spiritual, occupational, physical, intellectual and environmental. Reports	<p>Brenda Schell, MRN Director</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MRN Recovery Advocacy Day was held on March 5 at the Capitol. Over 80 people attended. 26 Representative and Senators visited that day. The after the event Brenda was contacted from an individual who is running for the State Senate who is in recovery. She reported that it is great to see individuals in recovery running for office. • MRN is currently working on cultivating Recovery Legislative Champions who will advocate for public policy that are good for people in and seeking recovery from a substance use disorder. Please let Brenda know if you would like to see a Rep or Senator for this. • MRSS 42 hour training for Stone County Drug Court-25 peopled attended. They are currently working with Stone County Drug Court to incorporate peers into the Drug Court Model. Stone County is one of 10 mentoring drug courts in the nation. • DMH has asked MRN to explore the feasibility of establishing a recovery housing organization that brings recovery house providers together. There are currently contacting housing providers statewide. The have approximately 120 on their list so far. A steering committee will be formed. They will be exploring other state models, doing site visits, recommend standards and a possible accreditation process, addressing funding. If you know of anyone currently providing recovery housing and would like to be on the steering committee please contact Brenda. • MRN has been asked to partner in establishing CIT training for local law enforcement in Jefferson City. They are working on gathering key individuals to help plan the training. • MRN Board of Directors will be holding their Strategic Planning board meeting April 24 & 25. • ATR-4-Twenty states were awarded funding for ATR 3 but this year only 5 states will be awarded the funding. PLEASE CONTACT YOUR US ELECTED OFFICIAL AND TELL THEM THE IMPORTANCE OF RESTORING FULL FUNDING FOR ACCESS FOR RECOVERY for 2015. If the funding is cut there will no longer be recovery support services provided. • DMH consumer Conference (Real Voices/Real Choices) will be held Aug. 17-19. MRN will again be providing 45 scholarships for consumers and family members to attend. <p>Lisa Doyle-Liaison-Credentialing Board</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Renewal season – applications are due April 30. Lisa Martin is working with the board to discuss the Peer Support Credential for CPS - similar to the MRSS certification. The target for this is July. • Staff went to the Drug Court Conference and MACA Conference. Stacey will be attending the ICRC conference as well. There will be an Interventionist Training in Kansas City in May.
