| Behavioral Health Division Director’s Report & Budget Update | <p>Laurie Epple, Deputy Director of Administration</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Laurie shared her thoughts about how great the Mental Health Champions Banquet was. It was very inspiring. • Spring Training Institute-over 750 individuals who attended. There were a multitude of topics covered. She attended a session on Chinese healing practice called Qigong. This is categorized under Wellness and was very relaxing. Governor Nixon spoke and brought up the last minute tax cut bills that the General Assembly pushed through. He encouraged everyone to speak with their legislators • Proposing more services to ATR: Peer Support, Family Treatment Home, LPN qualified Staff to extended day treatment. <p>Budget</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ADA budget grew by 7% and CPS grew almost 9%. Total combined \$78 million. • 2% provider rate increase • 1.9 million in ADA medication increase • Continued funding \$1 million for offenders re-entering St. Louis Treatment Center-Gateway • Adolescent Psychiatric Increase for ADA & CPS • GR-Strengthening Mental Health System-Includes MHFA, CIT, Emergency Room Enhancement, Community Mental Health Liaison, they have added 2.5 million to a KC pilot for the Emergency Room Enhancement, 2 FTE for 2 Psychiatric Resident Spots at UMPC, Columbia | |

| Committee Workgroup Reports | <p>Prevention Workgroup</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Crime bill passed-decriminalized now able to have 10 grams of marijuana HB 2238 passed-CBD-2 (to help children who have severe epileptic seizures) needs to be monitored (THC) to make sure the correct amount and type are being used. Clinical trials are included in the bill. In St. Joe-Dr. Shaul is up for re-election and is against prescription drug monitoring. Dr. Steuber is running against Dr. Shaul and is for prescription drug monitoring. Susan Depue-did 2 presentations at Spring Training one on intervention, and on prescription monitoring. Stephanie does HIV presentations. She did one for Adults in a local drug court.
