

MISSOURI CHILDREN'S WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES (MOCDD) WAIVER

- Missouri is approved to serve only 366 children in this waiver.
- The MOCDD waiver is for children who have an ongoing waiver habilitative service need and use at least one waiver service monthly.
 - Services available through the MOCDD Waiver: Assistive Technology, Applied Behavior Analysis, Community Specialist, Crisis Intervention, Day Services, Environmental Accessibility Adaptations-Home/Vehicle Modification, Respite, Personal Assistant, Person Centered Strategies Consultation, Specialized Medical Equipment and Supplies, Support Broker, and Transportation.
 - The MOCDD Waiver IS NOT for children who only need MO HealthNet services such as private duty nursing. Private duty nursing IS NOT a service through the MOCDD Waiver.
- To be eligible for the MOCDD waiver, the child must be eligible to receive Division of Developmental Disabilities (DD) services as defined in State and Federal Regulations.
 - You must first contact your local Regional Office to determine basic eligibility for Division of DD services.
 - The Division of DD Regional Office will further determine the eligibility for the MOCDD Waiver and if ongoing waiver services are needed for a child.
 - The child must be determined by the Division of DD to meet an Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disability (ICF/ID) level of care and be at risk of entering an ICF/ID institution if not provided waiver services.
 - The child must be living at home with family and under the age of 18. This means the child is not in a residential facility, group home, or admitted long-term in a hospital institution.
 - If the child is determined eligible for the MOCDD Waiver, he or she will be placed on a wait list. On a quarterly basis, available MOCDD waiver slots are offered to children on the wait list who have the most critical unmet needs. Support Coordinators contact families to assist with completing the required forms.
- If a child is determined eligible for the MOCDD waiver, parental income and resources are not counted, and the child is approved for MO HealthNet (Medicaid) based only on the child's income and resources.
 - In the event that a child qualifies for MO HealthNet with a spend down based on their family income (which would allow the child to access services from other division waivers once the spend down is met), they may still qualify for the MOCDD waiver. However, before granting a MOCDD waiver slot the division will work with the family to determine whether the spend down requirement can reasonably be met.
