Autism Spectrum Disorders: Evidence-Based Practice and Interventions

This module explores the importance of using evidence-based interventions when working with children and youth with autism spectrum disorders (ASD). The module provides an overview of 11 interventions that have the strongest research evidence for their effectiveness. It also discusses factors to consider when choosing interventions for individual children. School personnel, care providers and family members will learn of additional resources that can enhance their ability to select and provide high quality interventions for children and youth with ASD.

The module is hosted on the University of Missouri Extension web site. To view the training you will need to register for an Extension Passport and select the *Autism Spectrum Disorders: Evidence-Based Practice and Interventions* course. There is no charge for the Passport or to view the training.
