1. Programs Affected

- 1.1 Adult and Children’s Community Psychiatric Rehabilitation (CPR) Programs.

2. Background and Purpose

- 2.1 This bulletin provides clarification on drug testing within children and adult Community Psychiatric Rehabilitation programs.
- 2.2 Drug testing is used to determine and detect a client’s use of alcohol and drugs.
- 2.3 Drug testing may be performed on-site or may be sent to a laboratory.

3. Policies and Procedures

- 3.1 The program identifies goals, policies and procedures regarding drug testing.
 - 3.1.1 The program shall implement written policies and procedures regarding the collection and handling of specimens.
 - 3.1.1.1 Urine or other specimens shall be collected in a manner that communicates respect for persons served while taking reasonable steps to prevent falsification of samples.
 - 3.1.2 The program shall implement written policies and procedures outlining the interpretation of results and actions to be taken when the presence of alcohol and/or drugs has been determined.
 - 3.1.2.1 Test results shall be addressed with the person served once the results are available in order to intervene with substance use behavior.

4. Qualified Personnel

- 4.1 Agency staff administering, collecting and or evaluating drug screenings must be trained and must meet the requirements as indicated by the drug screen manufacturer. Staff must follow all agency’s policies and procedures regarding drug screens. If laboratory services are used, the laboratory must be licensed/certified by the Department of Health.

5. Documentation and Data Entry

- 5.1 Procedure codes 80300 or 80301 are used for drug testing and billed to the CPS Adult or Youth Laboratory Tests service category in CIMOR.

- 5.2 Use 80300 for single or multiple drug class procedures on-site using direct optical observations (e.g. dipsticks, drug test cups, cassettes, and cards that are interpreted visually, with or without instrument assistance) for Class List A drug classes (see Class List A below).
 - 5.2.1 80300 may be billed once, irrespective of the number of direct observation drug class procedures or results on any date of service.
- 5.3 Use code 80301 for single drug classes included in Drug Class List A, performed by methods other than direct optical observations (sent to laboratory services) once per date of service.
 - 5.3.1 80301 may be billed once to report single or multiple procedures performed, irrespective of the number of procedures, classes, or results on any date of service.
- 5.4 Each test must be documented in a consumer progress note with the category or type of test (on-site or laboratory), the number of panels, types of drugs tested for, and the test results.
- 5.5 Test results and actions taken shall be documented in the client's record.
