IMR/IRT Training for ACT Teams Well-known national trainers, David Lynde and Christine Powers spent three fun and information packed days with team members from 14 Missouri Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) teams training on Illness Management and Recovery/Individual Resiliency Training (IMR/IRT). A variety of team members, including team leaders, peer specialists, employment specialists, program assistants, community support specialists, substance use specialists, and nurses, came together to learn how to assist the people they serve in setting recovery goals and learning information, skills and strategies to get back on their feet and work towards having a rich, full life. David and Christine train and consult with many states around several evidence based practices including ACT, IMR, Supported Employment and Integrated Treatment for Co-occurring Disorders (ITCD). They both commented several times, about how refreshing it is to come to Missouri and see the collaboration, partnership and support between the ACT teams and the Department of Mental Health staff.

- 4. Medical Directors Meeting Summary This meeting was held on August 27. The group discussed the recent SAMHSA CCBHC Medical Directors Conference held July 30-31. Medical Directors from eight of Missouri's 15 CCBHCS attended. Clinical staff from six additional centers attended, along with Dr. Stanislaus, Natalie Cook, and Dorn Schuffman. Missouri is significantly ahead of other states in several areas, one of which is planning for CCBHC's continuation beyond the demonstration period, which ends next July. Dorn noted that the Coalition plays a key role in Missouri's national leadership. Most states do not have a strong provider association that works closely with their departments of mental health. The group next received an overview of the PPS from Dorn and Mark Schwarz (Director of Government Affairs for the Coalition) led a discussion of recent statutory changes, most notably changes in Assistant Physician (AP) legislation. Rachelle Glavin led a discussion about a revamping of the Behavioral Pharmacy Program

(BPM) and Relias presenting a new tool they plan to test that will help medical directors make better use of the BPM reports. Dr. Stanislaus provided an update on the implementation of the Opioid STR grant, including a discussion about the Medication First model.
