DBH Updates and Policy Guidance

March 29, 2019

1. **Allocation Transfers** - Fiscal staff have completed their financial analysis for FY 2019 community obligations/contracts. Due to the level of projected federal earnings, at this time and until further notice please be advised that we will **not** allow the following:

- Transfers of funding between agencies
- Transfers of funding between contracts within a single agency
- One-time funding
- Funding over allocation within CIMOR will not be done.

This policy will be re-evaluated in May.

2. **Fiscal Year End Billing Cutoffs:**

- **Medicaid cutoff – 6/02/19 (Check date 6/27/19)**
- **Non-Medicaid cutoff – 6/16/19 (Check date 6/28/19)**

Cutoff Dates for Services will be as follows:

Medicaid – Applies to CSTAR/CPR/TCM/ACT/CCBHC

The last cutoff for IGTRM Medicaid billings to use the FY19 allocation is **6/02/19** (check date 6/27/19). After the cutoff DMH Central Office will transfer all remaining dollars to Non-Medicaid for CPS. For ADA, the balance remaining in your redirect will be moved. If there is a need for more than your redirected amount please submit your request to Becky Wolken and Vicki Schollmeyer.

All requests to transfer funds into IGTRM Medicaid allocations must be submitted **no later than noon on May 28th** to:

All Medicaid services billed after 6/02/19 will be paid from your FY20 Medicaid allocation.

Non-Medicaid – Applies to CPS (non-Medicaid), CSTAR (non-Medicaid), PR+, SATOP, Compulsive Gambling, Recovery Supports and CCBHC (non-Medicaid)

The last invoice cut-off for non-Medicaid encounters is **6/16/19** (check date 6/28/19). If you need money moved from Non-Medicaid to Medicaid Ineligibles you will need to complete the Allocation Transfer Request Form (attached).

All non-Medicaid transfer requests for FY19 must be submitted **no later than noon on June 11th** to:

All Non-Medicaid services billed after 6/16/19 will be paid from your FY20 Non-Medicaid allocation. **June 16, 2019, is a tentative billing date based on prior year information. DMH reserves the right to change this date based on the MHD RA cycle.**

3. **SAMHSA Guide on Best Practices for Prescribing Antipsychotics to Youth - Guidance on Strategies to Promote Best Practice in Antipsychotic Prescribing for Children and Adolescents** - The safe and effective use of antipsychotic medications for children and adolescents in the United States is a critical issue in mental and substance use treatment. To address this issue, SAMHSA partnered with national experts to develop this guidance. The document provides a “bird’s eye view” of systems-level strategies to inform public and private sector decision-makers, prescribing clinicians, and other key stakeholders in designing and implementing antipsychotic monitoring programs to improve outcomes for youth with mental disorders across the nation
4. **SOAR, (SSI/DI Outreach, Access and Recovery), A Step in the Recovery Process** - The following link can be handy for the case manager trained in SOAR. The library contains an Application toolbox complete with worksheets, samples or forms and the Medical Summary Report along with other tools and worksheets to move you through the process. Remember, if your agency is not successful with SOAR there may be numerous reasons. Primarily consider your candidates for applications. If the individual is not experiencing homelessness or at high risk of homelessness, and/or does not have a mental illness, SOAR is not the appropriate tool. When you identify an appropriate candidate, use the tools available, **including your local lead**, (contacts list) to help you turn in a good application the first time. 5. **Healing House Grand Opening** - On Friday, March 22, Healing House celebrated the Grand Opening of their Recovery Community Center in Kansas City. Healing House raised \$3 million to renovate an old bowling alley into a beautiful gathering place for recovery services and supports. The new building will provide recovery support groups, individual peer support, an employment specialist, access to computers and support in using them, and a special room for family reunification visits. 2. **Child-Parent Psychotherapy (CPP) Learning Collaborative** - Missouri Coalition for Community Behavioral Healthcare will be sponsoring an 18-month long Child-Parent Psychotherapy (CPP) Learning Collaborative in Jefferson City beginning in June, 2019. The Learning Collaborative (LC) model is the dissemination strategy used by the National Child Traumatic Stress Network to support uptake of best practices. What sets an LC apart from traditional training is the intensive focus on learning by doing. An LC includes in-person trainings or “learning sessions”, intensive consultation, and peer-to-peer learning within and across organizations. Participants who complete the training will be eligible for the roster of trained CPP clinicians. Please ensure that your agency leadership and all members of your team who might be part of the training are aware of the core components and minimum training requirements for a CPP Implementation Level Course.
