FYI Fridays DBH Updates and Policy Guidance April 12, 2019

1. Budget Update - The Senate Appropriations Committee held markup hearings this week. The Senate left two items open for further discussion and several items will be going to Conference Committee.

Next week the Senate Appropriations Committee will meet again to hear all open items and proposed house bill language. The two items left open by the Senate for DBH are for a ward expansion at Metropolitan St Louis Psychiatric Center (MPC) for individuals found incompetent to stand trial and ordered to DMH for inpatient competency restoration and a Forensic Case Monitor for the St Louis area. If the Senate decides to fund these items, they too will go to Conference Committee.

Currently the items going to Conference Committee for DBH include:

- CCBHC Continuation The Senate recommended a \$12.8 M reduction to GR, offset by \$12.8 M Federal addition, due to the possibility of an extension of the CCBHC Demonstration at the federal level and noted that the Conference Committee considering the status of federal action at that time would address the differences in the House and Senate positions. The DMH will be providing information and an impact statement to legislators next week.
- Health Transitions Grant The Senate recommended a new decision item for a newly awarded grant.
- Medicaid Utilization NDI The Senate is proposing to restore the GR reductions made by the House.
- Eastern Region for Community Access to Care Facilitation NDI The House recommended \$1M of federal authority, the Senate zeroed it out.
- 2. Nixon Forensic Center Staff Open House On April 9th and 10th an estimated 1200 hospital employees and their family members attended an open house at new building at Fulton State Hospital and were provided the opportunity to see where staff would be working when patients are moved later this summer. The new building was reviewed enthusiastically by staff who voiced their excitement about their future work setting. Contractors and employees remain busy making finishing touches to furnishings on livings, developing policies and practices applicable to the unit, and training staff.
- Update on DMH Administrative Rules The certification standards for Behavioral Health Healthcare Home are final and published in the Code of State Regulations. The rules have been moved to Core Rules for Psychiatric and Substance Use Disorder Treatment Programs, 9 CSR 10-7.035. https://www.sos.mo.gov/cmsimages/adrules/csr/current/9csr/9c10-7.pdf

The DRAFT proposed amendment for Emergency Safety Interventions has been posted to the DBH website for informal public comments which are due April 30, 2019. The rules are available at: https://dmh.mo.gov/ada/dbhregdrafts.html

The Department's Licensing Rules have been posted to the DBH website for informal public comments and include numerous revisions to condense the rules into a more user-friendly format. The rules include requirements for the following community behavioral health programs: Family Living Arrangements, Day Programs, Intensive Residential Treatment Services (IRTS), and Psychiatric Individualized Supported Living (PISL) if those programs are not nationally accredited or are in the process of obtaining accreditation. The revised **CPR rules** have been approved by the Governor's Office and will be filed with the Secretary of State in the near future. **Providers will be notified when the rules are published in the** *Missouri Register* **at which time there will be a 30-day formal comment period.**

- 4. Forensic Conference was a Success! The Missouri Department of Mental Health, in partnership with the Missouri Coalition for Community Behavioral Healthcare, held the Forensic Conference on April 3-5 at the Capital Plaza Hotel in Jefferson City. Approximately 140 professionals attended, including staff from each inpatient facility, staff from DBH and DD, as well as several community treatment providers. The conference provided a variety of sessions/topics including courtroom testimony, mental health courts, community treatment options, involuntary medication, and current substance use trends. Those from DMH who made presentations included Mark Stringer who provided opening remarks, Dr. Felix Vincenz presented on the history of state psychiatric hospitals, Dr. Rick Gowdy presented on the history of forensic services, and Deaton DeGrant and George Killian presented on sexual offenders and media use.

Appropriate organizations would include treatment providers, social service organizations, homeless outreach, organizations that serve survivors of domestic violence or sex trafficking, LGBTQIA+ related organizations, medical providers, and others who interact with those who are at risk of witnessing or experiencing an opioid overdose. - Opioid Use Disorder as a Brain Disease
- Opioid Overdose Background: Learn about opioid overdose causes and trends
- Opioid Epidemic: Learn about existing efforts to combat the opioid crisis and legislative protections for naloxone use and dispensing
- Opioid Overdose Prevention, Recognition, and Response: Learn how to correctly identify and respond to an overdose event, including how to administer naloxone, and how to prevent future overdoses
- Delivering Overdose Education and Naloxone Distribution (OEND): Learn how to provide clients with overdose education, and either distribute or recommend how and where a client can acquire naloxone.
- MO-HOPE Evaluation: Learn how to participate in MO-HOPE evaluation protocols, including teaching clients/patients how to complete "Overdose Field Reports" when naloxone is used to reverse an overdose
