Story shared by Kiki's mom

Kiki is on the autism spectrum. She loves to be part of her community. Kiki's mother, born and raised in rural Kenya, is a single mother of two daughters and has a full time job. Through self-directed supports, Kiki's mom is able to recruit caregivers who can take Kiki to activities she enjoys. For example, Kiki enjoys swimming. Through self-directed supports, Kiki's mom recruited caregivers who know how to swim and can supervise Kiki in the swimming pool. Kiki is very athletic and enjoys sports-related activities. These wonderful women enjoy doing other activities with Kiki such as hiking, jumping on the trampoline, and walking the trails at the park. In addition, Kiki's mom has been able to recruit caregivers who are willing to adjust their schedules to meet the needs of Kiki.

Kiki used to struggle with playing appropriately with other children. Her social skills have tremendously improved over the last year, and she has friends with whom she enjoys playing. Kiki is also able to sit in a restaurant, eat her meals using appropriate table manners, and clean up after herself.

Kiki's mom knows how challenging caring for children on the autism spectrum can be. It can be even more challenging for single parents who have to pull double duty. Through self-directed supports, Kiki's mom is able to take one weekend off per month to recuperate. Kiki's mom indicated that by taking "me time," she is able to replenish her energy, be healthy, and provide quality supports for her daughter.






Empowering Through Employment – June 2018 Update





The Growth of Self-Directed Supports (SDS)






