DBH Updates and Policy Guidance

- Real Voices, Real Choices The 11th Annual Real Voices, Real Choices Consumer Conference begins on Sunday,
 August 25. The event brings approximately 800 participants from across the state and is focused on empowering
 and providing resources to individuals with mental illness, substance use disorders, and developmental disabilities.
 The conference concludes at noon on Tuesday, August 27. Additional information and Frequently Asked Questions

- 2. SOR Billings Due RE: Year 1 Opioid SOR Grant services billing. As you are aware, year 1 of the Opioid SOR grant will be ending September 30, 2019. We will be issuing new year 2 allocations for providers in September that will begin October 1, 2019. We are asking that providers have ALL of their year 1 billings in to us by October 20th, 2019. Any billings that occur after this will hit year 2 allocation.
- 3. SAMHSA's 2018 National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH) Report Data Findings This week, SAMHSA released the latest data findings from the 2018 NSDUH. NSDUH provides estimates of the use of illegal substances, prescription drugs, alcohol, and tobacco, as well as mental disorders, treatment, and co-occurring substance use and mental disorders in the United States. NSDUH data also help to identify the extent of substance use and mental illness among different sub-groups; estimate trends over time; and determine the need for treatment services.
- 4. **NSDUH State Barometers** Find the NSDUH data broken into state barometers to allow comparison between MO to other states, regions and the nation on various data points! https://store.samhsa.gov/product/Behavioral-Health-Barometer-Volume-5/sma19-Baro-17-US
- 5. Family Support Update New Family Support Providers have been hired around the state and will have their opportunity to attend training September 25 27. Family Support keeps families engaged in services and gives much needed peer mentorship for parents and caregivers who may feel overwhelmed by their children's diagnosis. 7. No-Cost Half & Half | MAT Waiver Training - Opioid STR/SOR, in partnership with the Missouri Coalition for Community Behavioral Healthcare, is providing an 8-hour MAT Waiver Course. This course is different from the traditional 8-hour live course, as the first 4 hours will be in person and second 4 hours will be individual online work. If you obtain your buprenorphine waiver following this course, you (or your agency) are likely eligible to receive \$500 reimbursement for your time*.
