- National Council Medical Director Institute Releases Report on Mass Violence Earlier this month, the Medical Director Institute (MDI) of the National Council for Behavioral Health released, <u>"Mass Violence in America: Causes,</u> <u>Impacts and Solutions,"</u> a comprehensive report following recent episodes of mass violence in El Paso, Texas; Dayton, Ohio and Gilroy, California. This webinar covers the MO HealthNet (Medicaid) annual review process and how DMH agencies and providers can assist consumers. - 4. MHD Physician Manual Updates The following updates have been made to the Physician Manual.
 - 13.12.D Performing provider information was removed. The language was too restrictive.
 - 13.17 Supervising physician was replaced with collaborating physician. Supervision practice agreement was replaced with collaborative practice agreement.
 - 13.47, 13.47.A, 13.47.E Clarifying information was added about who can bill psychiatric services in a nursing facility. Incorrect information was removed.
