DBH Updates, Notices, and Policy Guidance

October 18, 2019

- 1. DMH MAT Data A recent report on the use of addiction medications in DBH consumers who have a diagnosis of opioid use disorder (OUD), alcohol use disorder (AUD) or both (as identified by EOCs in CIMOR) was made available. The following are some key takeaways!
 - The use of medications for AUD and OUD (and co-occurring) has been increasing in each of the last three years!
 - Not surprisingly, most of the addiction meds being used are for individuals with a diagnosis of OUD.
 - As of last FY, just over half of individuals with an OUD diagnosis were receiving MAT (51.5%); nearly half (45%) of co-occurring OUD/AUD were getting addiction meds.
 - Sadly, still less than 10% of individuals with an AUD diagnosis were receiving addiction meds (FY19). We have work to do!!
 - For OUD, bupe products are used most (67.5%); methadone is second (23.8%) in FY19.
 - For AUD, naltrexone products are used by most (90.9%) of that, 45% are using Vivitrol (for FY19)
 - For OUD/AUD in FY19, bupe products are used the most (60.4%), naltrexone products are second (30.9%) and methadone is last (19%).

- 3. **SOR Billings Due October 20** Please note that all SOR billings for Year 1 must be entered by October 20, 2019. Any billings submitted after that date will hit Year 2 allocations.
- 4. **CPR Maintenance Reminder** The Maintenance level of CPR is **coded to end October 31**, **2019**. Effective November 1, you will no longer be able to bill for any consumers enrolled in this level. A **revised report** showing all consumers currently enrolled in the Maintenance level has been placed in all provider's FTP folders (Reports/CPS). **Please move all Adult and Youth CPR consumers from the Maintenance level into the Rehab level**.
- 5. **ASPE Report to Congress on CCBHC Demo** The HHS office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation has completed its second annual report to congress on the CCBHC Demonstration Project. Medication Awareness Recovery Training Starting - The MCB will be starting a new 40 hour Medication Awareness Recovery Specialist Training Program on *Friday, November 8th, 2019* with live training in Jefferson City, St. Charles, Joplin, Kansas City and Cape Girardeau. This program is a comprehensive training program that provides 40 hours of training on using medications during the recovery process.
