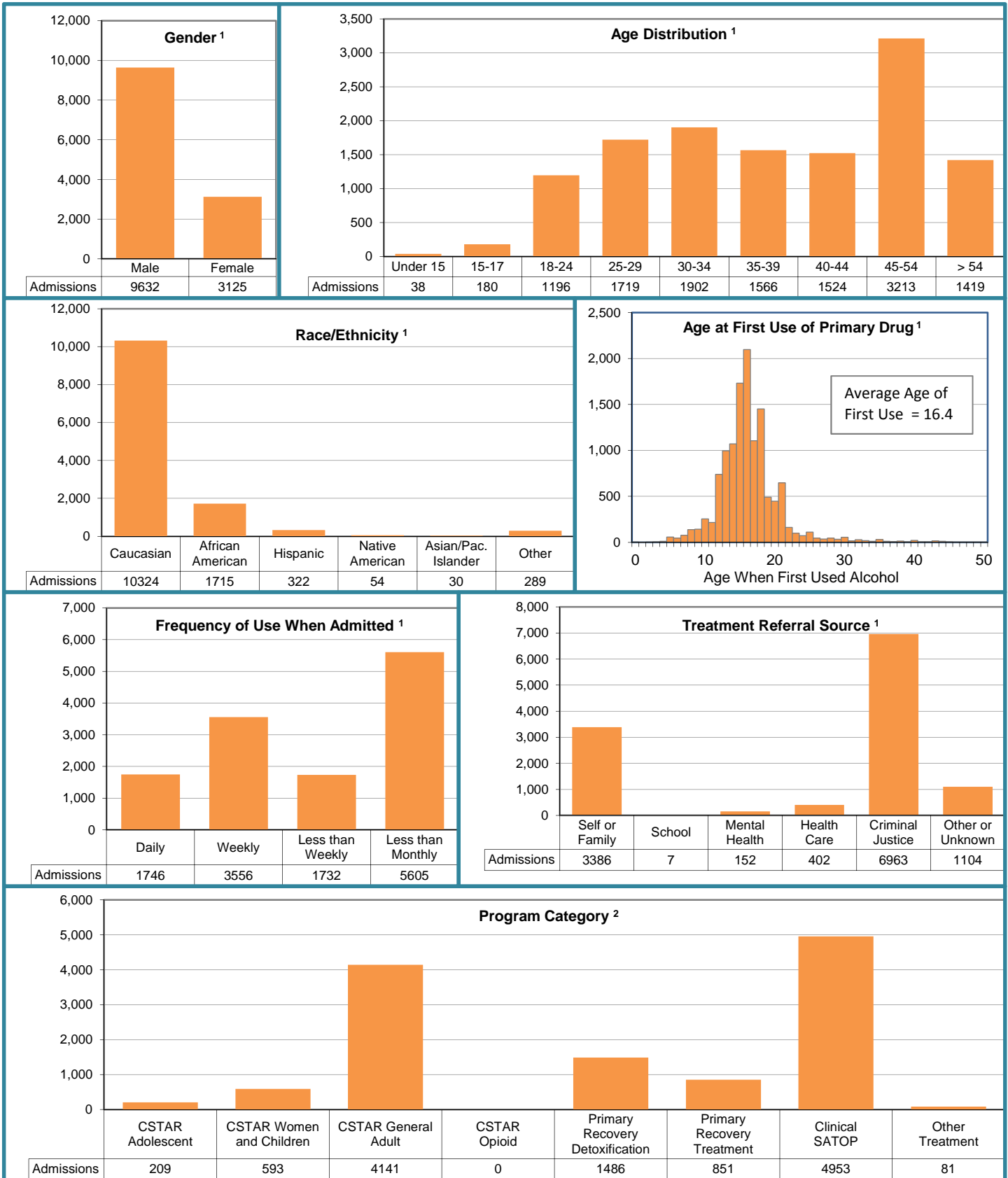

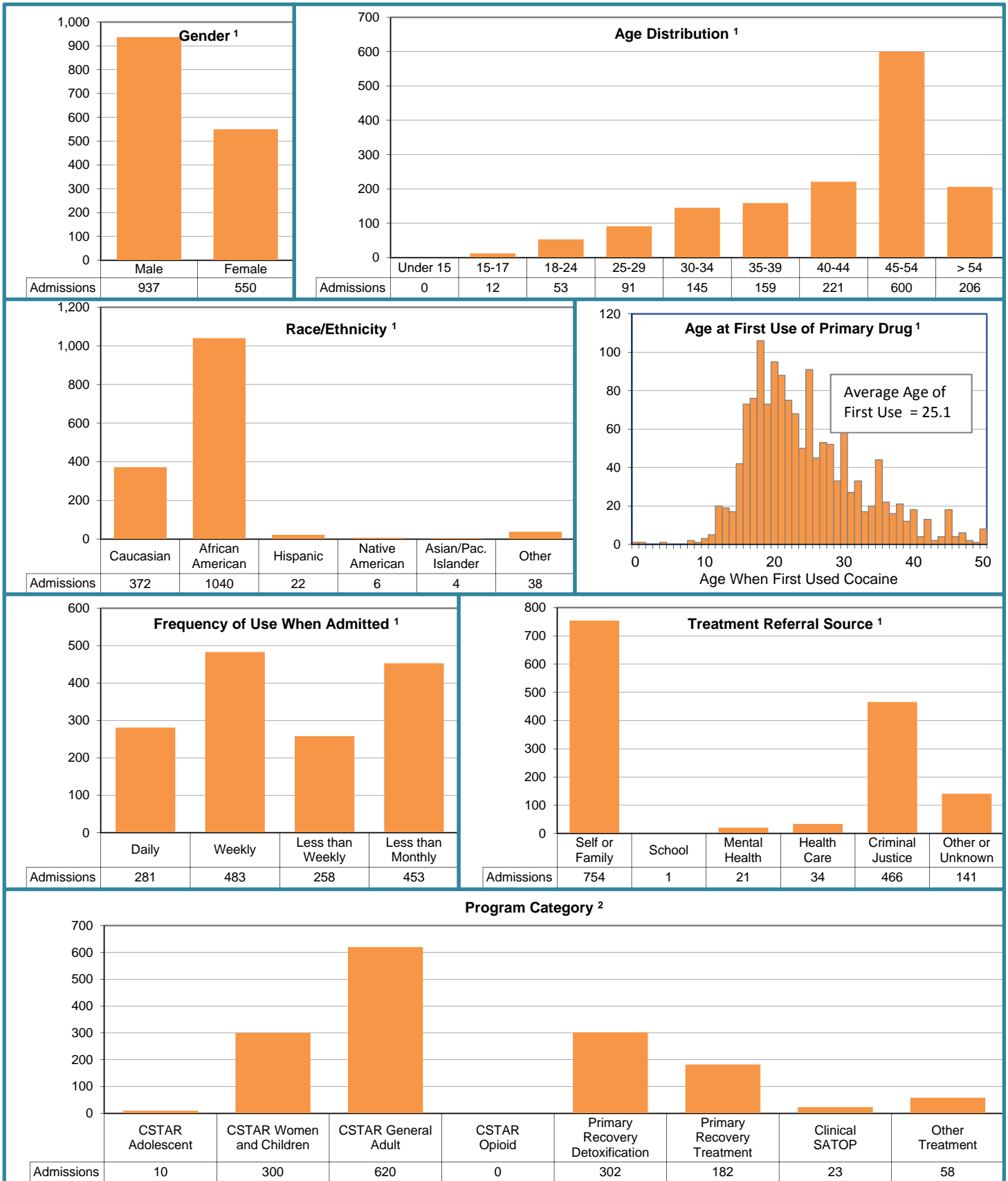

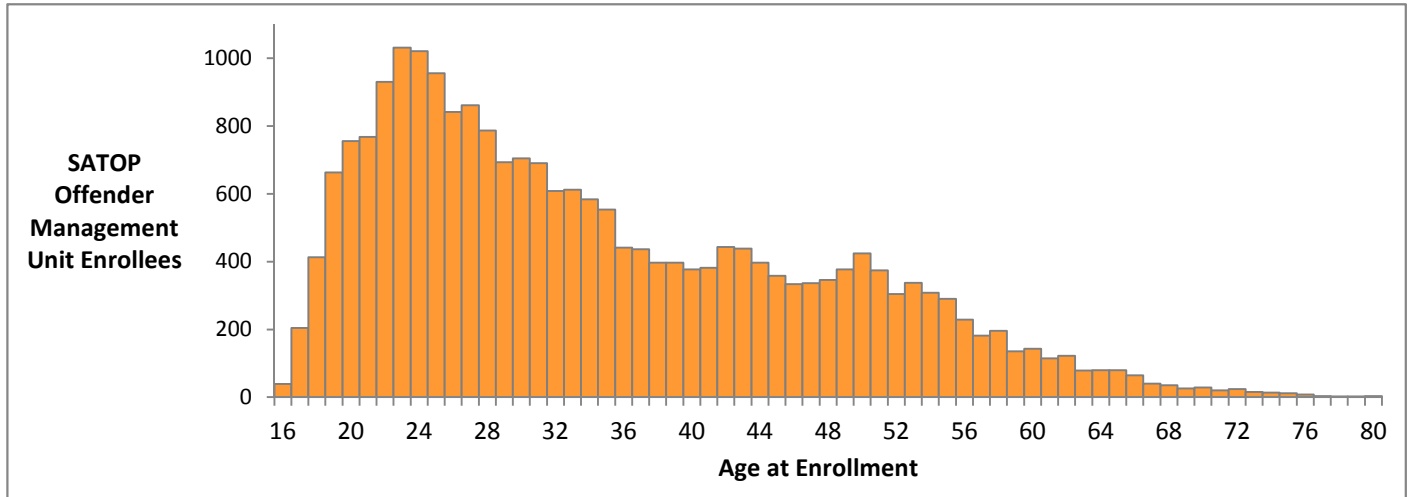

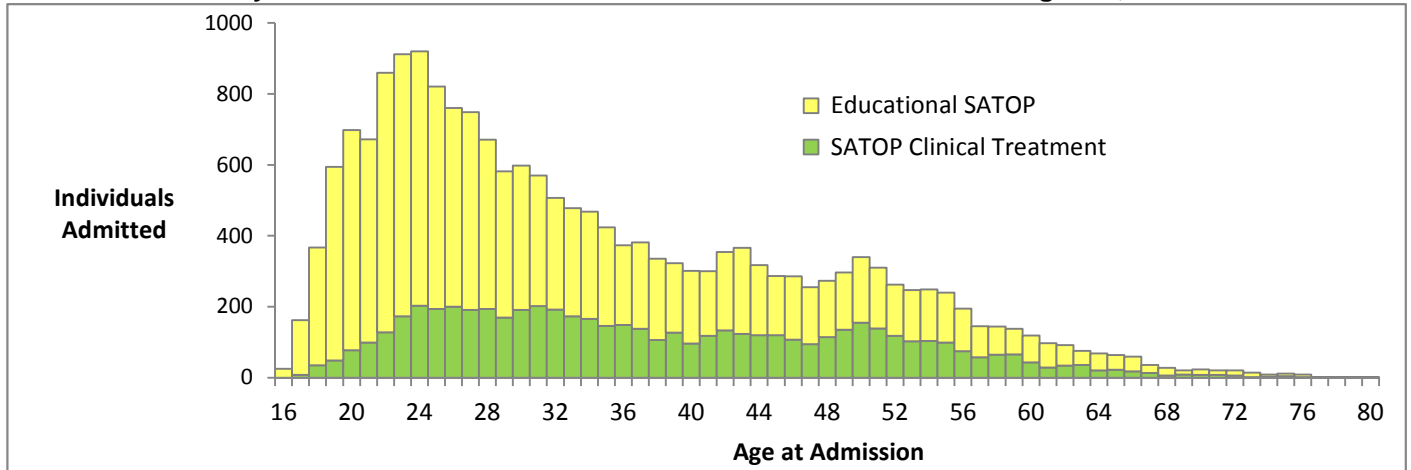
## AGE PROFILES OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE INTERVENTION AND TREATMENT PROGRAM ADMISSIONS

### Individuals Assigned to Substance Abuse Traffic Offender Program (SATOP) Offender Management Units (OMU), Fiscal Year 2014



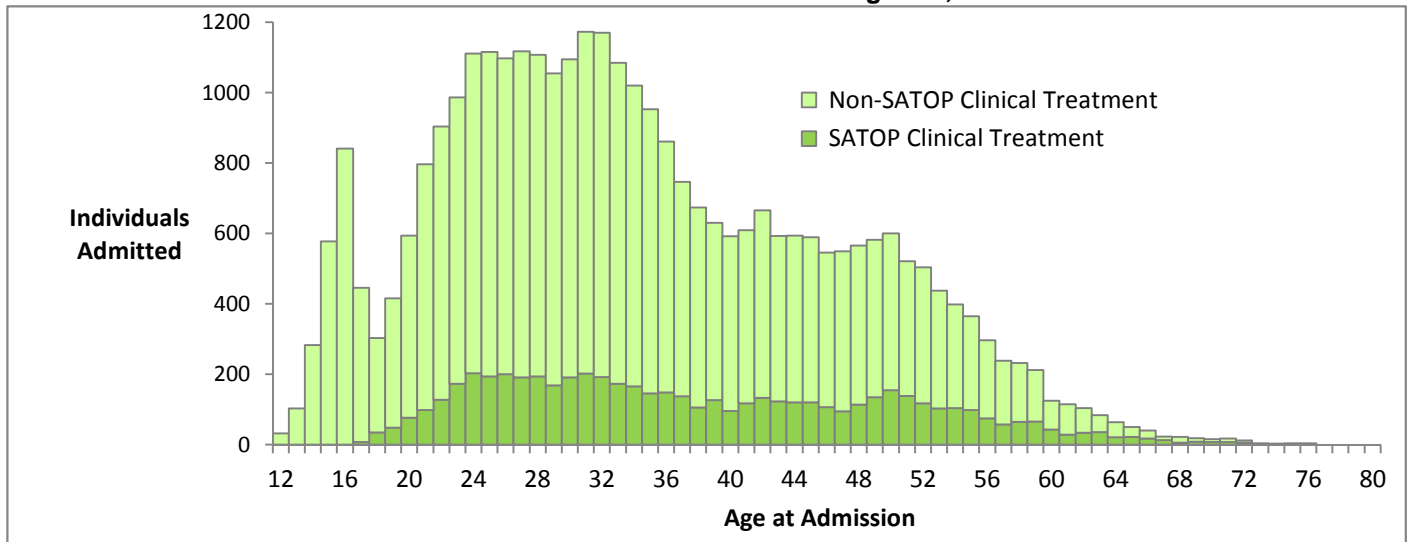
