## DBH Updates, Notices, and Policy Guidance

March 13, 2020

Budget Update – On Wednesday, March 11, the Chair of the House Budget Committee presented his recommended changes to the rest of the Committee. One of his recommendations included the <u>fund switch of the \$5M MAT money, moving it from GR to Federal Earnings</u>. DBH staff are in contact with House appropriations to explain the impact and lack of revenues DBH is generating to support this move.

Legislative spring break is March 23-27, 2020. Senate is in recess and will return after spring break. The House is working on the budget only— and relaxing rules so they can send it to the Senate by the end of next week. House committee hearings are cancelled for next week.

Trauma-Informed Schools ECHO Missouri Telehealth Network (MTN) launched Trauma Informed Schools ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) with the goal of assisting school districts interested in making trauma informed system changes and helping students and families get access to mental health services. DMH and DESE have partnered to promote this tele-mentoring opportunity for school districts and local community mental health providers. - 4. **CCBHO QIP reporting** If your agency has not submitted FY19 shadow claims for the QIP measures, the final submission due date is March 31, 2020. The estimated QIP payout date for this submission is May 15 June 1, 2020.
