DBH Updates, Notices, and Policy Guidance April 17, 2020

- 1. Budget Update The General Assembly is due to return to the Capitol on Monday, April 27. We know that the FY21 budget previously moving through the approval process is now scrapped. Given the COVID-19 crisis, the budget is being completely redone, clearly under a tight deadline. Unfortunately, we expect that DMH will be significantly impacted by restrictions, if not reductions.
- 2. **Allocation Transfers** At this time Medicaid to Non-Medicaid transfers will be allowed. Please be advised that we will NOT allow the following:
 - Transfers of funding between agencies;
 - Transfers of funding between contracts within a single agency; and
 - Funding over allocation within CIMOR will not be done.
- 3. **COVID-19 Emergency Grant** Yesterday, the DBH received our Notice of Award (NOA) for the \$2M emergency grant. As I noted on the provider calls, this grant will focus primarily on co-occurring disorders, but there is also a carve-out for treating healthcare providers specifically. The grant requires completion of the GPRA. There was just enough time to provisionally plan it and write it...now we dive into the necessary details. More information about the rollout of this grant is forthcoming!

ONDCP Releases COVID-19 Fact Sheet - The White House Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) released a COVID-19 fact sheet detailing the Administration's priorities related to substance use disorders (SUD). ONDCP has identified the following priorities in response to the pandemic: helping Americans who struggle with addiction; expanding the use of telemedicine and electronic prescribing; increasing flexibility for treatment with methadone and buprenorphine; ensuring access to controlled substances; and supporting rural communities. Each priority includes various resources from federal agencies and links to guidance documents that have been issued to address the pandemic.
