Federal Public Health Emergency Extended

- Effective July 20, 2021, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services issued a
 declaration that a federal public health emergency is still in existence related to COVID19. The previous declaration was set to expire July 19, 2021. The renewal will be
 effective for 90 days, or until Monday, October 18, 2021.
- The <u>Appendix K Addendum</u> will expire no later than 6 months after the expiration of the federal public health emergency.
- The Missouri state public health emergency has not yet been extended beyond August 31, 2021.
- The <u>COVID-19 Flexibility Authority Chart</u> was updated with several Code of State Regulations for Division of Developmental Disabilities 1915(c) HCBS Waivers. Per the guidance at the top of this chart, if multiple authorities exists, the flexibility expires at the earlier of the two dates.
