The First Responder Disability Awareness Training program at Niagara University is pleased to announce a Train the Trainer program for Law Enforcement personnel in the State of Missouri.

This training both sensitizes and educates law enforcement on how to effectively identify, address, and respond to various disabilities they will encounter in their line of duty. Content includes, but is not limited to, disabilities defined specific to law enforcement, community resources, the Americans with Disabilities Act, Recognize-Identify-Approach-Interact-Response (RIAIR) model, victimization/abuse, etiquette/interaction skills, CIT interface, service animals, and person/identity first language.

The train the trainer program option is developed strictly for law enforcement personnel with the intent to TRAIN other law enforcement officers, NOT a training session for those who do not intend to train their peers. This training is free. Lunch is on your own.
