Now. 24 "Lisa Nothaus" (541304320) 00:03:18.000 --> 00:03:26.910 Our youngest daughter has a developmental disability, and she lives at home with us. She actually receiving services through the vision and our. 25 "Lisa Nothaus" (541304320) 00:03:26.910 --> 00:03:38.490 Local TCM entity so I've been involved in the DB systems in some fashion for the past 30 years at least. So, that's kind of me. In a nutshell. I feel like I've been around forever. 26 "Lisa Nothaus" (541304320) 00:03:38.490 --> 00:03:46.890 I'm gonna turn it over to David now, cause he's got a lot of great information to share with us and I'm going to pass the box to you, David, and you can control the slides. 27 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:03:46.890 -> 00:03:54.510Yeah. 35 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:04:41.274 --> 00:04:52.404 I'm director of Missouri assistive technology, and it's certainly a pleasure to be here and have the opportunity to speak in particular with individuals and with families about assistive technology. Um, you know.

41 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:05:38.544 --> 00:05:51.864 Um, later on, the other reason I bring this to your attention is the fact that if you move out of Missouri, it's always useful to keep in mind that there is an equivalent of us in every single state. Plus the territory is like Puerto Rico and.

46 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:06:29.359 --> 00:06:40.739 The arena these days, it seems to be increasing. There are more programs or more services. There are more funding opportunities. We have more discussions and we have our or our, um.

47 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:06:40.739 --> 00:06:49.794 Plans that we develop and so really what we're talking about when we use the term assistive technology is we're talking about any kind of technology device.

48 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:06:49.794 --> 00:07:00.714 It can be what, uh, you know, the term assistive technology, or it could be mainstream technology but we're essentially talking about any kind of technology that helps a person with a disability.

49 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:07:01.334 --> 00:07:13.274 Increase maintain, or improve their functional abilities, so that's a really broad category in terms of all the types of things that fit under this term assistive technology.

51 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:07:20.739 --> 00:07:33.004 We're kind of referring to an umbrella term and so we have the devices and we also need to make sure that when we have this discussion with family with friends with providers, that we're focused on the devices.

So, let's move to the next slide and let's get into the who we are and what we do and we will start by talking about our demonstration centers around the state of Missouri.

57 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:08:20.739 --> 00:08:35.494 Is out there a lot of times we come to it at different stages in our life, and we need to kind of have some place that we can go and we can learn about it. And so part of what we do is we operate a series of demonstration centers around the state right now. We have 12 of them.

00:08:46.914 --> 00:09:00.714Um, so they're spread out throughout the state and the whole idea behind the demonstration centers is so that you have some place locally that you can go to and you can sit down with somebody who has a background and assistive technology and kind of. 61 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:09:00.739 --> 00:09:13.424 Talk through the whole world of assistive technology and then hopefully also spend some time, trying some devices comparing and contrasting the devices that you're trying getting hooked up with programs. 62 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:09:13.454 --> 00:09:20.654 You know, just kind of these are think of the demonstration centers is your gateway to assistive technology. And so at the very. 63 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:09:20.739 --> 00:09:24.179 And I'll show our website and so if you're trying to. 64 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:09:24.179 --> 00:09:33.749 You know, if you don't know if there's a demonstration center in close proximity to you, I'll show you where on the website you can find that information. So if we move on to the next slide. 65 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:09:34.614 --> 00:09:45.594This is our loan program called ATC. It's really critically important, especially when we're using public dollars to make sure that we are getting the right device for the situation. 66 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:09:45.894 --> 00:09:53.724 When we start to identify assistive technology. A lot of times we start with a discussion around barriers. What is the barrier that the. 67 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:09:53.749 --> 00:10:00.794 Individual is encountering and then we sort of narrow down what devices are available out there that might help them address that barrier. 68 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:10:01.124 --> 00:10:13.574 But it's really important to make sure that somebody has the ability to try devices in their natural environments before making a final selection. So, if I say, say, I'm a college student, and I have a. 69 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:10:13.749 --> 00:10:21.389 Stability and I know that my reading load is going to increase and so I want to see what technology's out there that's going to help me. Um.

70 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:10:21.389 --> 00:10:36.384 Address that larger reading load that I'm going to have well, I could borrow several devices out of the program and then I could try, em, make sure that they helped me address my barrier and then later on, I can go. And if I, I can find funding through the appropriate funding source. 71 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:10:36.384 --> 00:10:41.364 So, think of the program or device loan program is essentially a large library. 72 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:10:41.389 --> 00:10:53.864 Have assistant devices that can be borrowed, uh, to try in various environments for various situations. Everything about is free. Um, we have well, over 1000 devices available through the program. 73 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:10:53.864 --> 00:11:01.364 We even pay the cost of the shipping to the location and back to us, we try to work through brick and mortar locations, but. but 74 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:11:01.389 --> 00:11:15.544 We do sometimes loan directly to individuals, depending on the situation but the key thing here is, you know, you want to try devices, you want to try them in natural environments. This is a great way to be able to, um, get your hands on them for various purposes.

75 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:11:15.544 --> 00:11:20.944 And we, we spent a lot of devices to school districts to be our offices to rehab hospitals.

76 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:11:21.389 --> 00:11:29.909 To employers, you know, just people who are trying to match up the right piece of assistive technology for the individual. If we move on to the next slide.

77 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:11:31.014 --> 00:11:39.894 This is another service that we have throughout the state of Missouri, and this is our device for utilization centers across the state. There. You know, a lot of times.

78 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:11:39.894 --> 00:11:49.794 And there are those things that you need, and maybe it's too cumbersome to try to get them funded or you need them today. So you can do something tomorrow. And so the device for utilize.

00:11:49.909 --> 00:12:01.814 Centers which I believe right now we have 10 or 11 them across the state. Um, they are places that taken used durable medical equipment used assistive technology. They sanitize it. 80 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:12:01.814 --> 00:12:09.884 They make sure it's safe and they put it back out in the community most often for free. So, if I'm looking for maybe an extra wheelchair that I could. 81 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:12:09.909 --> 00:12:23.854 You know, transport easily, um, or a bath bench, or a hospital bed, or maybe even an augmentative communication device. Then I would want to be familiar with the device for utilization programs. Um, and so we have the centers. 82 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:12:23.854 --> 00:12:29.884 And then another option that we have is what we call swap and shop, which is a service that is on our on our website. 83 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:12:30.354 --> 00:12:40.704 And so swapping shop, sometimes people have paid out of pocket for a piece of assistive technology, and they want a few dollars, um, or they want to match it up with just the right family or something like that. 84 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:12:40.704 --> 00:12:49.884 So, swapping shop is like a classified ad service for use durable, medical equipment and assistive technology devices. Like I said, a 2nd ago augmented in communication. 85 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:12:49.909 --> 00:13:04.544 Devices as an example. So these are great things to be kind of put on your radar screen because you may need something now or somewhere down the road. You need that extra piece of assistive technology and, um, so you might reach out to the re, utilization center. 86 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:13:04.544 --> 00:13:09.824And I saw that there was a question about where these are located, and I will try to answer.

We've set up the re, utilization centers, but sometimes we can't find the funding that's necessary. 90 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:13:42.114 --> 00:13:49.584 So, we set up a series of alternative finance programs as we refer to them the most. Um, and there's several. 91 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:13:49.909 --> 00:14:01.994 Of these programs, um, but the whole idea behind the state financing activities is to sport individuals and purchasing and acquiring assistive technology and we, if we move on to the next slide, 92 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:14:02.504 --> 00:14:09.884we're most often thought of for the financial assistance programs, uh, with our shomi loans programs. And what these are. 93 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:14:09.909 --> 00:14:15.034 Is they are a financial loan so you do have to pay it back but they're a great opportunity. 94 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:14:15.064 -> 00:14:29.314Um, to if you're in a position to take out a loan, the low interest, they're extremely low interest of all the decisions on who gets a loan and who doesn't is made by a group of individuals. And then the. 95 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:14:29.909 --> 00:14:38.699 They also take into consideration some of the unique situations that folks have, um, as a result of having a disability and how that sometimes impacts credit. 96 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:14:39.024 --> 00:14:52.344 So, the types of things that we've done through the Shelby loans program, we do a lot of home modifications through this program. We do Van adaptations. We do, um, adapted vans themselves. 97 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:14:52.584 --> 00:14:58.374

Um, and we do augmented communication devices. So a lot of different things get funded. Do this.

98 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:14:58.699 --> 00:15:10.394 And it's a great way again. Like I said, to maybe achieve something today. Um, so you can do something else tomorrow and he gets tapped into by quite a few folks across the state.

99 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:15:10.664 --> 00:15:18.614 But there are 2 aspects of the shomi loans program that I think are a little bit under utilized in Missouri. The 1st, 1 is our workability component of the shomi loans.

100 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:15:18.699 --> 00:15:27.064 Program and that is, um, to help people be able to purchase equipment needed to work from home, or at a remote site.

101 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:15:27.304 --> 00:15:38.644 So, we start thinking about how covid has changed, um, how we work and there may be more opportunities for people with disabilities to become employed. And you're trying to figure out well, how can I get started working remote.

102 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:15:38.699 --> 00:15:52.014 For this company, or that company, or starting my own business going to workability loan might be something to consider uh, we'll fund assistive technology, but I'll also fund some of the other things that an individual may need to get themselves started.

Um, and then at the very bottom here of this slide, there are the micro
loans and so sometimes, um, you know.

104 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:15:58.699 --> 00:16:10.064 Somebody needs to get an iPad in an iPad with an app on it, like, um, you know, an app to help them read or to help them write or some kind of assistant app. But you don't have, you know, 300 dollars.

105 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:16:10.064 --> 00:16:18.524 And so these micro loan programs are designed to loan you the money so you can get that device. So you can do what it is that you want to do. do

106 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:16:18.699 --> 00:16:33.394 Do and then you pay it back slowly over time and we work with them to fix budgets a lot of times on the show me loans programs. So, a lot of opportunities there to utilize these, the other thing that I often pointed out about show me loans is a great way to build credit.

And a lot of times people with disabilities need to build credit. 108 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:16:38.699 --> 00:16:49.344 Because they don't have it or they're trying to improve it and we all know that. Our credit history is always getting checked on and it impacts us when we go out to buy a car or rent a house or purchase a house or something like that. 109 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:16:49.704 --> 00:16:58.614 Um, if we move on to the next slide, a couple of things that I want to make sure are on everybody's radar screen, especially for families that have kids that are school age and. 110 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:16:58.699 --> 00:17:02.219 The 1st 1 is the assistant technology reimbursement program. 111 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:17:02.219 --> 00:17:13.254 You know, under school districts have a lot of obligations related to how they educate students with disabilities. And 1 of the things that they are supposed to provide is assistive technologies. 112 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:17:13.284 --> 00:17:22.044 If it helps the student, um, access the educational curriculum. So the assistant technology reimbursement program, we do in conjunction with the Department of. 113 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:17:22.244 --> 00:17:33.134 Entry and secondary ad, and if a student has assistive technology written into their, and they are being served by a charter school or a public school, 114 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:17:33.134 --> 00:17:42.194 or maybe they're in a state school for the severely disabled that school can access the system technology reimbursement program to purchase that technology. 115 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:17:42.219 --> 00:17:50.134 That's written in the, you know, the sooner we can get assistive technology into the hands of students the more likely it is that they will succeed.

00:17:50.344 --> 00:18:02.134So, if you have a student that's on an AP, or you work in a school, and your school district is not aware of this program. This is a great thing to bring to their attention to help them connect the dots. We. 117 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:18:02.544 --> 00:18:14.994 Um, at any given year, probably around 300 students across the state, get helped with this program. Unfortunately, we're kind of winding it down for this school year, but I know we will have a back up and running next school year. 118 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:18:14.994 --> 00:18:22.044 So something to kind of keep in the back of your mind, especially if you're a parent and you have a student that has an, the next. next 119 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:18:22.219 --> 00:18:25.409 Program is our kids assisted technology program. 120 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:18:26.004 --> 00:18:36.954 And right now we are, we're out of funds temporarily here for this program, but we assume there will be some additional ones at the start of the next state fiscal year. 121 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:18:37.374 --> 00:18:45.324 But this is a funding source that we refer to as a funding source of last resort, meaning that if you have exhausted every. 122 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:18:45.409 - > 00:18:55.514Their funding source that's out there, or maybe you've started put together some funding sources they're kind of falling short to your goal, then you might look into the kid's assistive technology program, 123 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:18:55.514 --> 00:19:05.324 and it can provide funding for assistive technology for vehicle access modifications, um, for home access modifications for children, under the age of 20. 124 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:19:05.944 --> 00:19:18.004 So, as we see illustrated here on the right hand side, this young woman had reached an age where she wanted to be able to bathe independently, but due to her disability, it took a bathroom modification to do that. 125 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:19:18.274 --> 00:19:25.354 And we put in some grab bars and, uh, in a tub cut and a few other things and she's able to now.

126 "David Baker" (1390735616) 00:19:25.409 --> 00:19:38.694 Achieve that goal of bathing independently and all that was provided through the kid's assistive technology program. So again, if you've exhausted every funding source that's out there. Um, then you might keep this on your radar screen.

applications so that we can reach out to people as quick as possible.
