Purpose



To ensure people receiving Home and Community Based Services (HCBS), and their Person-Centered Care Planning (PCCP) team are given the opportunity to receive consultation, training, and/or technical assistance regarding individual rights and due process components.

Referrals



- Referrals can be made when:
 - A Interventions are proposed that limit an individual's rights and the PCCP team needs assistance or consultation,
 - The Due Process Committee identifies concerns of incomplete requests, prohibited practices, or the request lacks justification of components with the plan preventing it from moving forward, or
 - Rights restrictions are discovered without due process through monitoring or other regulatory actions.

Referrals



- Who Is Able to Make A Referral?
 - ! Individual,
 - Any member of their PCCP team,
 - ♠Support Coordinators,
 - Division staff, or
 - Pue Process Review Committee Chair (DPRC).



- The QPS Lead will review the referral information and assign a QPS within 3 business days.
- The QPS will review the referral information and contact he requester via email or phone, within 5 business days from the date of the assignment.
 - The QPS will attempt contact by phone and/or email, with an alternative communication method tried if the attempts are unsuccessful.
 - A If there is no response made within 14 business days of the initial referral, the referral will be closed out and the QPS will send notification to the requestor of referral closed due to non-contact.



The QPS provides consultation, training, and/or technical assistance as requested to the person making the referral and other members of the PCCP team as applicable.



- The QPS will:
 - Respond to request
 - Encourage the use of positive behavior supports and least restrictive interventions
 - Be the point of contact for the individual, guardian (if applicable), PCCP team, and subject matter experts (SME) when requested



The QPS will:

Assist the planning team to enhance the ISP when the team is having difficulty with a specific component, there is uncertainty about documentation requested, or when a due process request is declined by the DPRC due to lack of information or justification



- In scenarios where additional consultation is needed from other Division team members, the QPS will consult with the QPS State Lead, if applicable, then request subject matter assistance for consultation
- The QPS will schedule, hold, and facilitate a specialized consultation with the SME and applicable PCCP team members within 5 business days.

Resolution



- If resolution cannot be achieved, the QPS reaches out to the QPS State Lead for assistance. Within 2 business days, the QPS State Lead may recommend the QPS consult with:
 - The Division's Provider Relations and Targeted Case Management Technical Assistance team for identified trends or provider concerns, or
 - Applicable Central Office team members for additional support.

Individual Rights and Due Process

There are occasions when an individual who is supported through the Department of Mental Health may require some type of intervention that limits or restricts their protected rights and/or ability to fully participate in their community and other activities. Due process is the procedure that protects individuals from *undue* restrictions and limitations of their rights.

On these occasions, the individual and their support team submit a plan to be reviewed by a Due Process Review Committee. The plan includes specific components to ensure the individual has been given the opportunity to make an informed decision and to consent to the intervention, and it establishes a clear plan is in place that specifies exactly how this individual will have their rights fully restored. If the Committee determines that due process has *not* occurred, the plan will be referred to an Individual Rights Consultant for education and/or technical assistance.

Rights Consultation Request




Individual Rights Consultants (IRCs) assist individuals and their interdisciplinary support teams in a variety of ways. The consultation that individuals and teams receive are individualized to the needs of the individual, the team, and the recommendations of the Due Process Committee (if applicable). Following are just a few examples of how IRCs can help:

- Assist teams in identifying rights restrictions and determining if a proposed intervention is the least restrictive and least intrusive for the individual;
- Explore ways to ensure that the individual and/or guardian are part of the planning process;
- Explore possible support strategies that could be helpful to assist the individual in developing the skills necessary to restore their rights and make referrals when appropriate;
- · Identify appropriate monitoring and data collection methods to determine the efficacy of the intervention;
- · Assist in the development of specific, observable, and measurable restoration criteria;
- Set an appropriate schedule for the review of data to determine if the restriction continues to be necessary; and
- Explore ways to ensure that the individual and/or guardian are provided the information necessary to make a
 decision about providing their consent, as well as what to do if they do not agree with the restrictions or
 interventions proposed by the planning team.

The ultimate goal of the IRCs is to build the capacity of teams and coach them to more independently navigate due process for rights limitations and restrictions for individuals.








