Hello everyone! This week, I want to talk with you about the Health Assessment and Coordination Service (HAC). HAC is 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, a group of doctors and nurses that are dedicated to helping individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (I/DD). The current HAC provider in Missouri is StationMD. HAC doctors are specially trained to help people with I/DD and can treat people through a simple telemedicine platform. HAC can help with any medical concern, like acute, urgent issues,

medication refills or behavioral episodes. HAC resolves more than 90 percent of the calls without the person needing to leave their home! All DDD Medicaid Waiver recipients are eligible and preregistered to begin using HAC immediately for any medical concerns.

## MO Tiered Supports

It is a multi-tiered positive behavior support consultation framework that focuses on teaching and coaching organizational teams to better serve individuals in their services.

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## Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) Claims Validation Soft Launch Follow-Up

MO DSS implemented the soft launch of claims validation for electronic visit verification (EVV) on January 7, 2026. The launch was successful, and MO DSS has begun analyzing the success rate of submitted claims. As a result of this analysis, the following reminders are offered.

The majority of the issues identified were related to a lack of matching visits in the EVV Aggregator Solution (EAS). This could be due to a number of things, including but not limited to:

- EVV is not being used by the provider
- The provider's EVV vendor is not sending visits to the EAS
- Visits in the EAS are not in a verified status
- Claims are being submitted before the EVV vendor sends the visit to the EAS

To ensure claims are paid after the launch of hard edits, providers should not submit a claim for a visit unless the visit is visible in the EAS and is in verified status. Per 13 CSR 70-3.320(3) (G), *EVV vendors must send data to the aggregator solution at least once daily for all dates on which visit data is captured by their provider agencies. Submitting claims before the visit is visible and verified in the EAS will cause your claim to be denied, with no visit found, because the claim could not be matched to a visit in the aggregator.*

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## Important MissouriBUYS information for TCMs, Service Providers – Action Needed

Missouri is in the process of moving to a new electronic system for purchasing, payments and other tasks. All entities that wish to receive payments from the state of Missouri (including DMH) must be fully registered in MissouriBUYS, powered by MOVERS. MissouriBUYS powered by MOVERS is different than the former MissouriBUYS (WebProcure by Proactis). You can register at [MissouriBUYS powered by MOVERS Registration](#). Registration can take 3 months or longer to complete, so please begin the process today. If an entity is not fully registered, DMH will not be able to make payments until the entity is registered.
