What are state-operated habilitation centers?

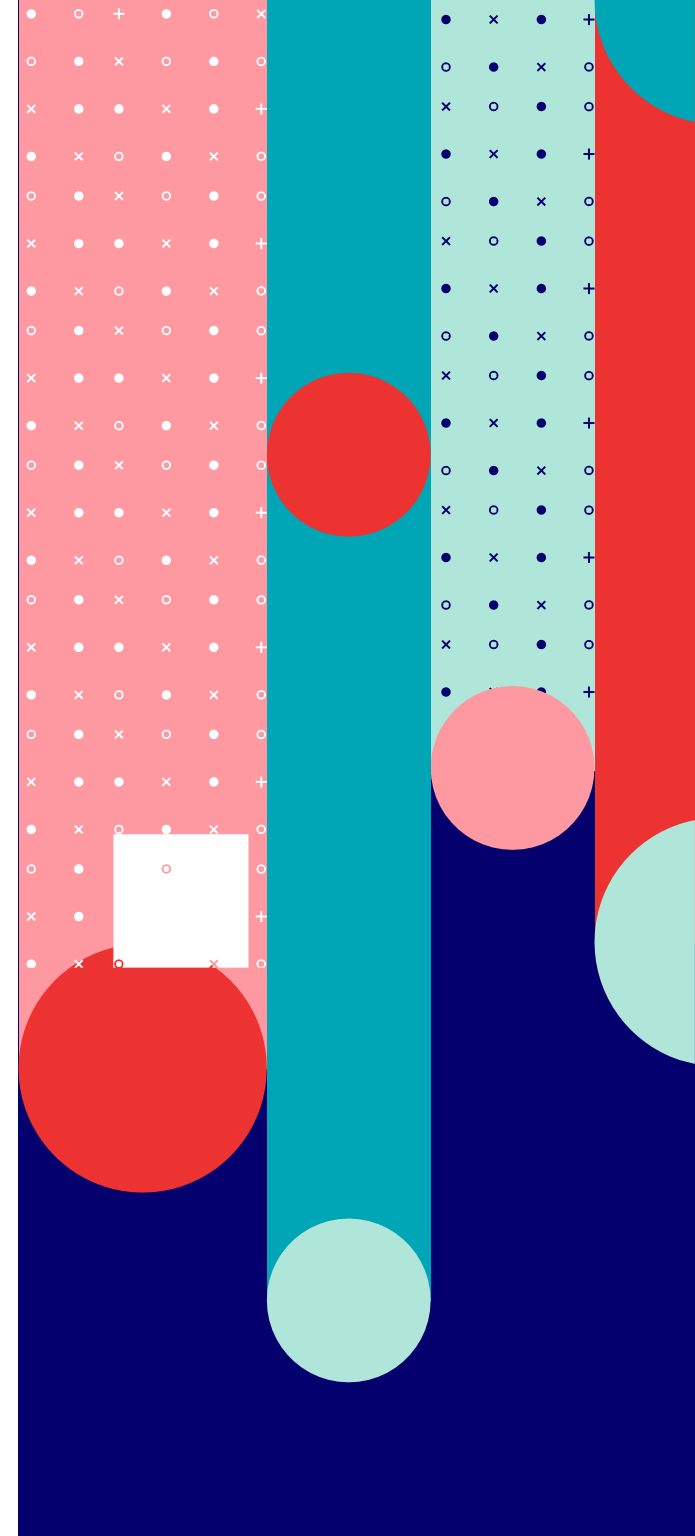
- **Facilities in which individuals receive 24-hour support in a congregate setting.**
- **Certified as Intermediate Care Facilities**
 - **Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities**
 - **Receiving long-term supports at the habilitation centers**
 - **Certified through the Department of Health & Senior Services**
- **Provide a variety of services**
- **Supports vary based on the need of the resident - residential supports, nursing, employment supports, occupational therapy, speech therapy, physical therapy, and behavior analysis services**

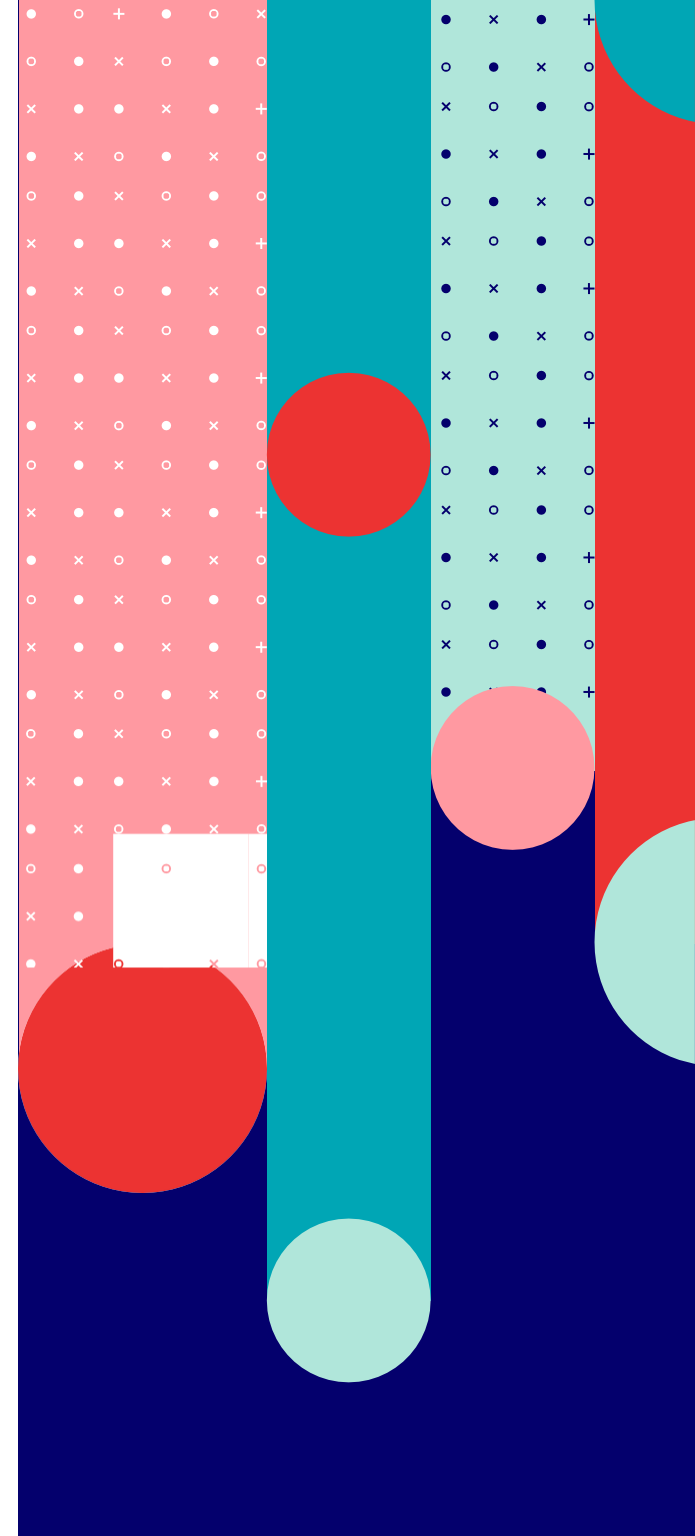

State Operated Programs

Who receives services in state-operated habilitation centers?

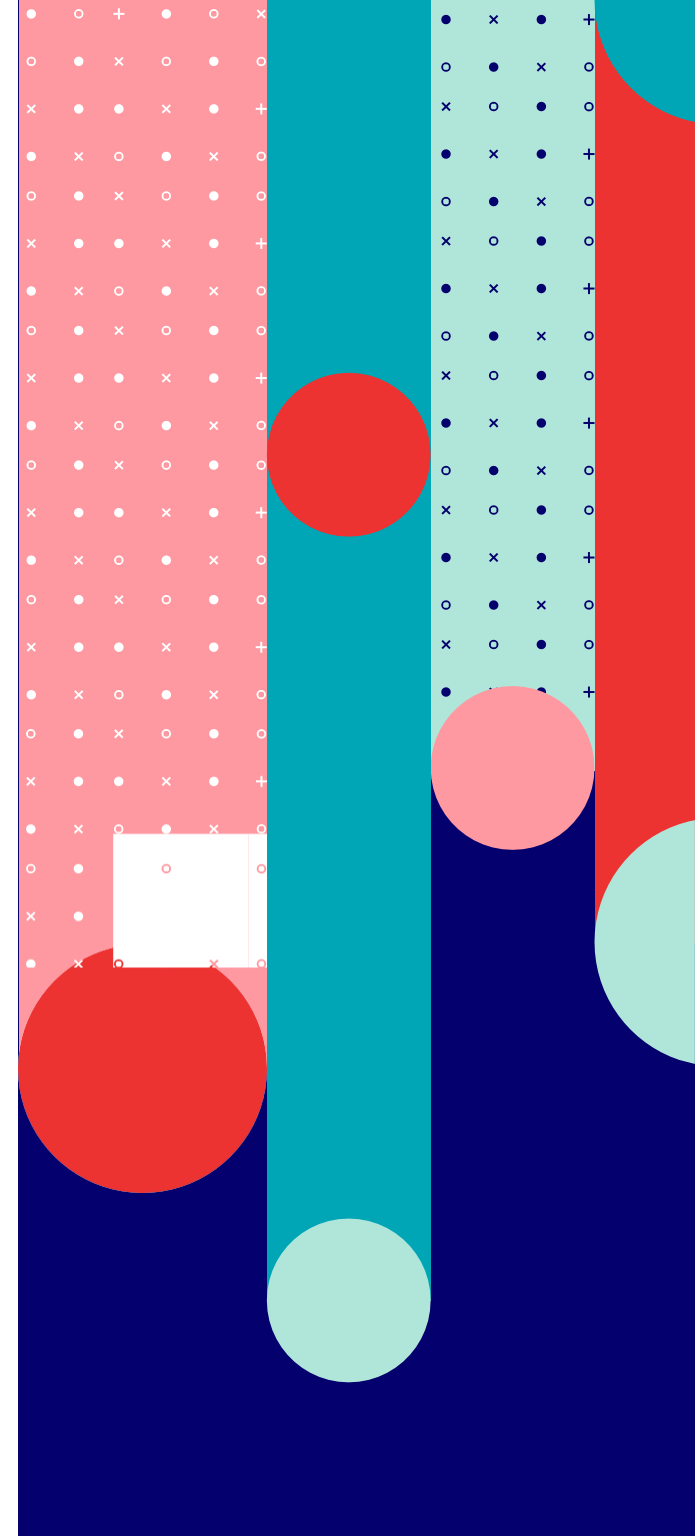
- No new admissions to habilitation centers
 - Habilitation centers remain open to continue to serve the long-term residents that live there, but no new residents can be admitted
- DOJ agreement 2007
 - Stopped admitting new individuals into the state-operated habilitation centers.
- Compliance with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act and the findings of the Olmstead decision
 - Individuals provided with options for community based services
- Only short-term supports through the crisis program
 - ONLY SHORT TERM



State Operated Programs

CRISIS Services

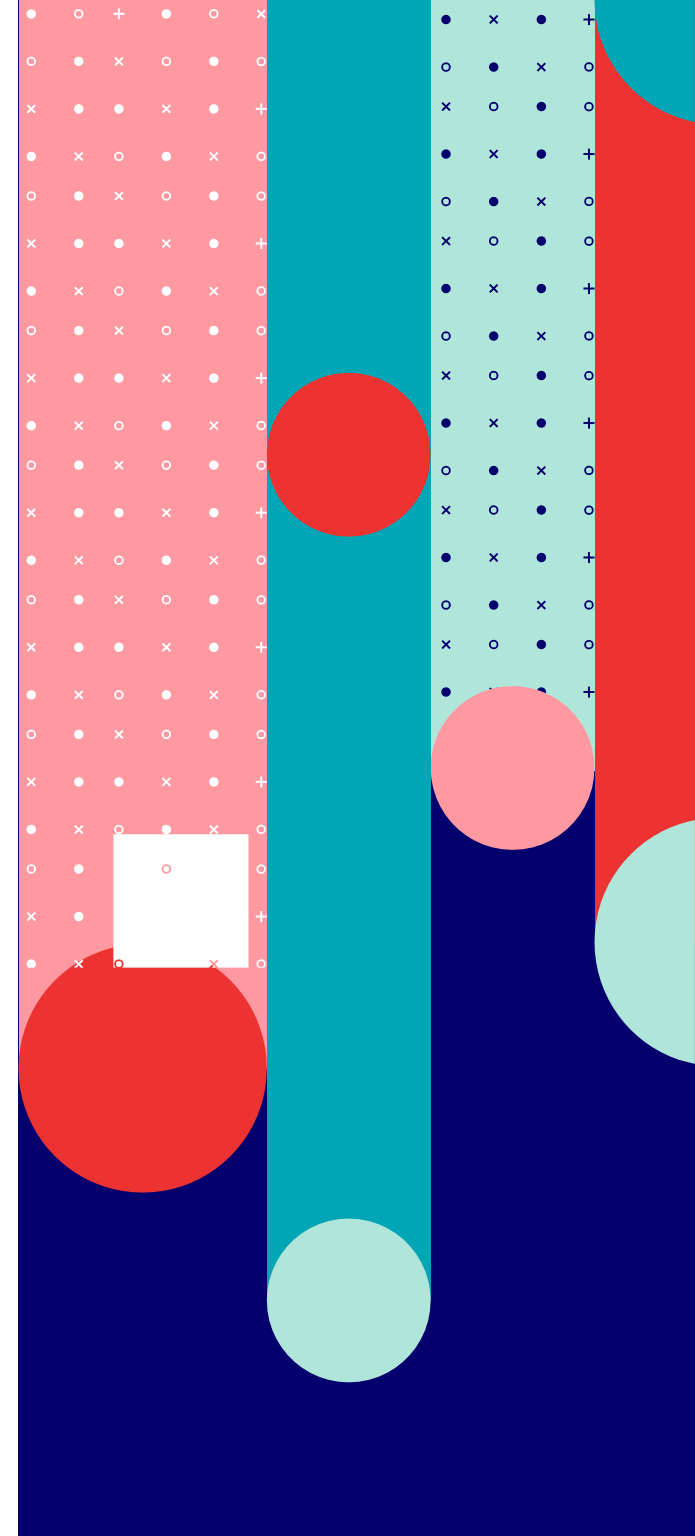
- Eligibility
 - At least 18 years of age
 - Have a developmental disability diagnosis
 - Have an open case with their local Regional Office
 - Approved for residential services with a comprehensive waiver slot
 - Current Criteria
 - Boarding at hospitals (The hospital has deemed the person ready for discharge but the person has no safe place to be discharged to)
 - Awaiting release from jail
 - Homeless



State Operated Programs

CRISIS Services - CONTINUED

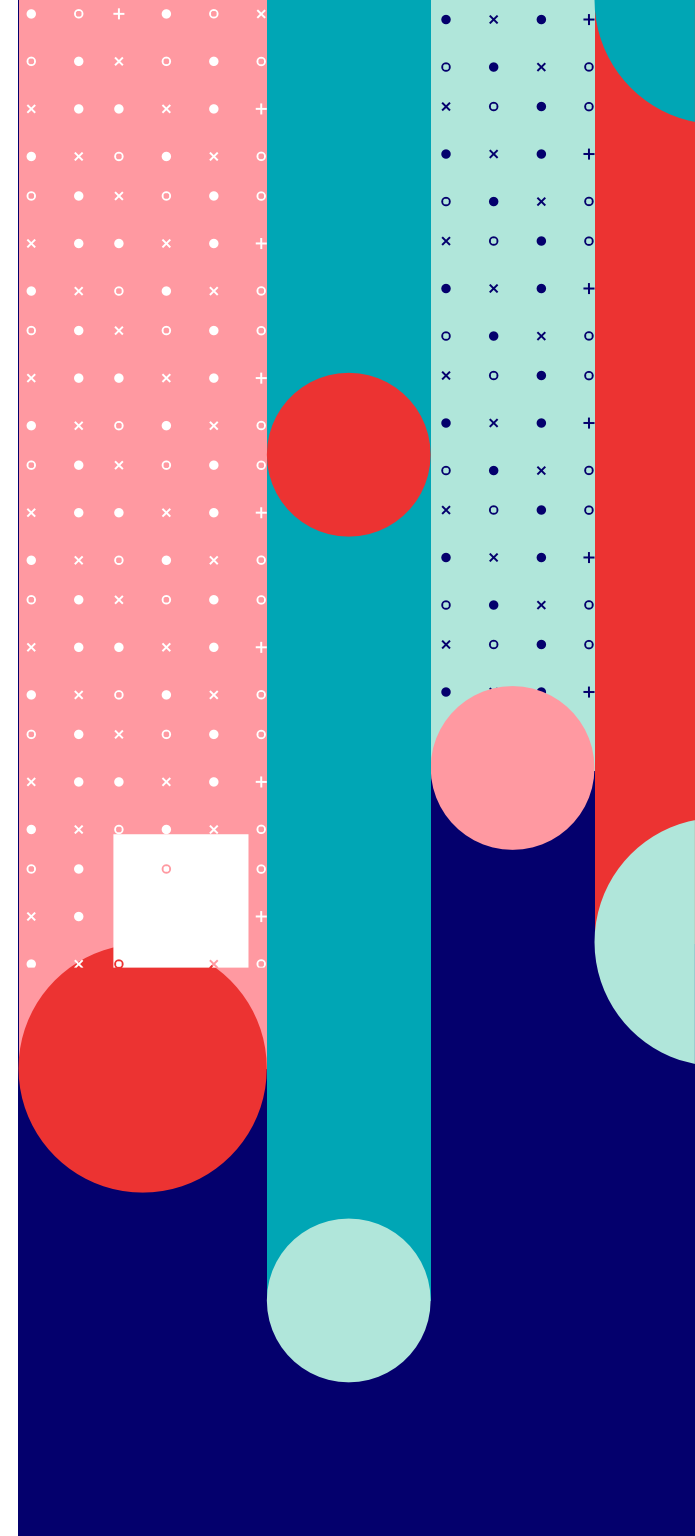
- Division Monitoring
- Referrals not accepted.
- As there are openings
 - Review eligible individuals
 - Next candidates
 - Based on length of time in need and the compatibility of the individual with potential openings
- The Coordinator of Crisis & Behavior Services
 - Notify team of Opening



State Operated Programs

Optimistic Beginnings

- Program based on Dialectal Behavioral Therapy (DBT)
- Individuals must have moderate verbal skills to participate
- Most restrictive DD state-operated crisis program
- Referral system is the same as for other SOP Crisis Services

What is Behavior Support Review Committee?

The Behavior Support Review Committee is the Divisions' way to provide support to teams across the state who provide services to individuals exhibiting complex needs through clinical consultation and follow-up coaching. The overall goal is to promote the implementation of best practice strategies leading to greater independence and an enhanced quality of life.

Who is the Behavior Support Review Committee?

It consists of the following:

- Three regional licensed behavior analysts who function as the chairpersons of the committee along with three Intensive Systems Consultants
- A member or members of the provider community licensed to practice applied behavior analysis or working towards licensure
- Other professionals as necessary to review the information and provide feedback
